It reflects the values of the 28th inter-Universities cross-country and Minor GUSA Games 2025, competition with purpose, unity in diversity, and pride in our shared heritage.

The emblem design is inspired by the unique natural and cultural identity of the University of Environment and Sustainable Development (UESD) and its host town, Somanya, surrounded by the Krobo Mountains, the iconic Adomi Bridge, and the Volta Lake. It reflects UESD's mission to promote sustainability, unity, and youthful energy through education, innovation, and sportsmanship. The design celebrates the convergence of nature, athleticism, and community spirit.

Krobo Mountain

- Represents the geographical terrain of Somanya, anchoring the mascot in its local context.
- Symbolizes strength, resilience, and endurance qualities essential to both athletes and environmental stewards.
- The layered green tones evoke growth, ecological harmony, and sustainability.

Adomi Bridge

- A central visual element, the Adomi Bridge stands for connection, unity, and inclusiveness.
- It reflects how the Mini GUSA Games bring together universities across Ghana, bridging diverse communities through sport and collaboration.


Spring of Water (Volta Lake)
